
Bridging the gap: The impact of library services on Trainee Advanced Clinical Practitioners (ACPs) and their professional development

support and library services for those returning to study.





The testimonials above show that our knowledge, skills, compassion and time are highly valued by our trainee ACPs. However, we have found - anecdotally - that they are also often overwhelmed at the prospect of returning to higher education. Particularly, the perceived lack of support from universities in bridging the gap between their information skills and course expectations. These concerns have been expressed to us in our training sessions and it is likely that the dedicated, 1:1 time they access through our services is a key reason as to why our support has been so valued. Our next aim is to carry out a small-scale research project to capture these experiences through interviews; to show both librarians and academics how we can better support experienced professionals in their return to academic endeavours.
